My motorsport background includes extensive involvement with the BMW Race Driver Series, where I have contributed both as a competitor and as a series organiser over the past ten years. Additionally, I've worked with the Ultimate Rally Group on events like Targa and the Silver Fern Rally, and more recently, I completed a four-year role with MotorSport New Zealand, focusing on competitor assistance, regulations and collaborating with various clubs and stakeholders within the wider sport.

As I join the NZIGP team alongside Tim, my goal is to enhance our operations and support you, our

competitors and volunteers. Whether you have any questions about our events or need assistance with entering our events, I'm here to help. Additionally, as an approved MotorSport NZ Licence Examiner based in Pokeno, I'm available to assist with licence exams as well.

Tim and I meet weekly in Pokeno, so there's always an opportunity to come say hi face to face. Feel free to reach out if you need any support or have any questions.



As can be seen from the header, following my accident, I am not able to drive and won't be driving again until at least September, so my involvement in motorsport is still limited.

As a reminder, there have been changes in how the Auckland Motorsport scene is managed. HRC and NZIGP over the last few years have jointly organised the Motorsport Club. So, when I decided to take a step back from organising events in June 2023, it seemed logical that NZIGP take a more active role in the management of events as a promoter again. I still have a role within the organisation as part of the NZIGP Legends Club and continue to mentor Tim in his role with NZIGP.

NZIGP will also continue to work with Auckland Car Club and TACCOC to avoid events clashing and spread classes between the organisations – ensuring that classes continue to have a good range of events in the Auckland area and at Taupo.

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As we work to finalising the NZIGP Events Race Calendar and Classes for the upcoming season, we thought it may be of interest to explain how we go about this process. It isn't easy and takes considerable time to achieve what we think is a good balance at our events.

Key considerations include:

- Aligning specific class race formats to fit within our event schedules, balancing 1-day and 2day formats.
- Exploring opportunities to combine classes to bolster grid numbers and accommodate other class requests.
- Offering alternative options for requested meetings.
- Recognising past loyalty to our events in our scheduling decisions.

The recent changes in plans with the MotorSport NZ promoter has also introduced some uncertainty, particularly regarding various class schedules.

Additionally, please note that at Taupo we have fewer dates compared to Hampton Downs, and the closure of Pukekohe has significantly increased pressure on other circuits to host events - given their varied operational schedules beyond race weekends.

ENTRY FEES

There have been some significant cost increases this year from our suppliers, but our ethos is to provide quality and value motor racing for everyday competitors. We are still working on the entry fee structure, but we are aiming for an individual entry fee of below \$460 plus levies with an additional fee of \$100 for those classes requesting four races.

Please note that those classes who have requested to pay an overall grid fee for their class will set their individual entry fees and will likely differ to the above.



Season Opener: Icebreaker - September 21-22

The NZIGP Events season is gearing up to start with our much-anticipated Icebreaker event on September 21-22. This year, we're excited to showcase a diverse lineup, including the BMW Race Driver Series with the NEXEN E46 Class, 2 Litre Class, and Open Class, Arrow Wheels ERC Series, the Carcolors Classic Trial, OK Cup, Formula Open New Zealand, NZ Sports Cars, Formula Junior, Historic Formula Ford and SuperKarts.

REV-UP YOUR GAME;

TOP PRE-SEASON TIPS FOR A WINNING START TO THE RACING SEASON!

- **Club Membership:** Renew your Club Membership to allow plenty of time for your Club to approve.
- MotorSport NZ Licence: Make sure you've applied for a new, or renewed licence take into consideration any medical checks you may need to satisfy renewal.
- Authority Card: If applicable, ensure that this is valid.
- Safety Gear: Check that all safety equipment, such as helmets, suits, and harnesses, are in good condition, up to date, and meets the required standards. Ensure your fire extinguisher is in date!
- **▼** Transponder: Ensure this is charged prior to the event, and the subscription has been renewed!
- **Vehicle Inspection:** Thoroughly check your car's mechanical systems, including brakes, tyres, fluids, and engine components. Ensure everything is in top working condition.
- Review Rules & Regulations: Familiarise yourself with any rule changes or updates in your racing series, as well as Schedule A. Understanding the new regulations can prevent costly mistakes.

This event provides a valuable opportunity for essential, low-pressure training in a live environment and allows us to reinforce procedures with our volunteer team.


Participants will engage in various training stations, including extrication, fire extinguisher use, flag marshalling, incident reporting, race control, and timing discussions.

KNOW YOUR RULES

MotorSport New Zealand have done some recent amendments, and in case you missed them we've summarise them below:

• (Amendment 36089)

During a Race Meeting, Safety Audits (where required) are now only required prior to Qualifying (however we still suggest getting them done as soon as you can).

(Amendment 36083)

From 2 September, Window Nets are now required where the driver side window is not in a closed position, or if the window aperture adjacent to a seating position containing an occupant, does not have window.

(Amendment 36083)

Window Nets now need to be approved to an SFI standard of FIA requirements - for more information check out Schedule A, Part Two, Article 4.5 (1).

(Amendment 36079)

New Competitors are now defined as those who haven't raced for a period of two years, are racing at their first three events, or racing at any circuit for the first time.



Formula Open New Zealand (FONZ) was established in 2018 following a discussion between historic motorsport commentator John (JT) Tomlin and the legendary three-time NZIGP winner Kenny Smith. Originally aimed at creating a historic series for Formula Atlantic/Pacific cars, it evolved into a combined historic and contemporary race series. The inclusion of former TRS Tatuus FT40's introduced a platform for both seasoned enthusiasts and younger drivers stepping up from Formula Ford among other single-seater classes.

The Series aims to offer opportunities for friendly competition and encourages participation and support among its members. The Series provides a platform for these single-seater cars to compete, regardless of strict compliance with MSNZ historic and classic standards, emphasizing sporting behaviour and driving standards.


FONZ features three separate championships running concurrently:
