it's your first time on the grid, understanding this process is essential to ensuring a smooth and safe event.

What is Scrutineering?

Scrutineering is a safety check performed by licensed officials before and during events.

Their goal?

To ensure your car meets all safety standards, allowing you to race confidently. Scrutineers are your allies, not obstacles—they'll help identify and address any issues with your car so you can get on track.

When will I be Audited?

While any vehicle can be selected for a safety audit, certain circumstances guarantee an audit:

- Vehicles without a MotorSport NZ logbook.
- Vehicles not audited at the last two events or within the past six months.
- Vehicles competing for the first-time.
- Vehicles with outstanding defects in their logbook.
- Competitors who request an audit.
- At least 15% of the vehicles at any event.

Scrutineering Etiquette

To make scrutineering smooth for everyone, ensure:

- Your car is race-ready: no loose items, tools, or clutter.
- The car is clean inside and out.
- All your personal safety gear is with you yes, every time.
- Your logbook is ready.
- You stay with your car; if you leave, remove it from the queue.

What's checked during an Audit?

The Chief Scrutineer creates a checklist before each event covering three categories:

- Safety Critical Items
- Safety Non-Critical Items
- Non-Safety Items

Audits focus on these categories, with results submitted to MotorSport NZ. If any issues are noted in your logbook, they must be addressed and signed off at the next event.


Common Audit Failures

These are the most frequent issues that cause cars to fail audits:

- Expired or improperly secured fire extinguishers.
- Unsecured batteries or unprotected live terminals
- · Worn or expired belts and gloves
- Non-flame-resistant overalls karting overalls are not fit for purpose.
- Helmets with missing or damaged labels and fittings, or in poor condition.
- Improperly installed or missing tow straps
- Inadequate race numbers
- Missing or outdated logbook photos now is the time to ensure the photo is up to date.

Key points to remember

- New safety cages must be inspected before your first event
- After an accident, it's your responsibility to present your vehicle and logbook to the Chief Scrutineer.



MotorSport New Zealand Log Books

Here's a quick reminder about your physical logbooks. Be sure to bring them along to every event, as they may still be required upon request.

While MotorSport NZ is transitioning to digital logbooks, some scrutineers may still rely on the physical versions and may need to update them manually if they're not yet fully integrated with the MotorSport Online system.

Transponder Placement

To ensure problem-free timing, here are a few reminders about transponders:

Make sure you've **renewed your subscription**, and your transponder is fully charged!

To ensure no issues, please ensure that you've mounted your transponder correctly as follows:

- For saloon cars, transponders shall be fitted to the inner guard rearward of the front axle centre line by up to a maximum of 200mm and within 500mm off the ground.
- For single seaters, transponders shall be fitted to the bodywork rearward of the front axle centre line by up to a maximum of 100mm and within 200mm off the ground.
- The transponder must have a clear view to the track, with no metal or carbon fibre beneath it.
- Ensure that the transponder cannot make contact with either the wheel assembly or the ground.
